<p>1878-? Born in Penn. Former cowboy. Personal smk hse of stucco reinforced with vertically arranged steel drums. Cone shaped roof w/ cedar shingles. Interior of gallery filled with his artwork: carved doll figures of Native Amer & cowboys, 3' bucking bronco of paper mache, images of frontier women, 2-headed antelope. Lined walls w/ tile & aluminum foil, mirrors, headlight reflectors & pieces of broken glass. Steel drums were painted with images from Native Amer & Hispanic folklore. Filled floors & walls with his works e.g. wind-powered carousel & moveable boxing figures. Some of artwork in Ft Collins Mus. Community was attempting to preserve at last word 3/83. From Muse, arts newspaper from CO 2/83. Story by David Brose, State Folklorist and Folk Arts Coordinator for CO Council on the Arts and Humanities. NB - although individual vision, he made his works accessible to the community in events like Cheyenne Frontier Days. Brian Moroney of the Ft.
